Help Animals India's primary purpose is to educate the USA public about animal and environmental issues in India in order to raise funds for specific animal shelters and projects in India. We also endeavor to improve animal welfare standards in India through working with animal sanctuaries, animal birth control and vegetarian related projects in India. Our chief project is the Visakha Society for Protection and Care of Animals (VSPCA) in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh, India. Help Animals India President personally goes to inspect as many of the projects as possible, without using Help Animals India funds every few years.

to the existing Kindness Farm; drainage improvements to prevent flooding; veterinarian salary; salary for the President; Disaster team and repairs to shelter after flooding; Adoption program for dogs and cats; "special needs" facility for the injured, old, Mom's with puppies and disabled dogs; sea turtle projection project; monthly horse wellness camps for the working horses of the area; specialized surgery for the "plastic cow" project (removing lethal plastic from cow rumens); ABC (animal birth control) for thousands of dogs; general operating expenses including animal feed and medicines for approximately 1300 animals including 800 large animals i.e. cows, buffaloes and horses and 500 small (dogs, cats, monkeys, birds turtles, rabbits). All animals are rescued and spay/neutered and living a good life in this eco-sanctuary.

Shelter which includes facility for the Pet and Street Dogs and complete boundary wall, the funds also used for Salaries of Veterinary Assistant and Veterinarians. Part of the grant is used for Animal Birth Control and Anti Rabies Vaccination program and Education and Awareness Program in the rural areas of Ranchi. Grants were given for renting billboards throughout the city to educate people on helping street dogs through rescue, ABC (animal birth control) and adoption; support lead to the control of the street Dog population in the city leading to zero deaths from rabies. This is a very big achievement for organization of their size. \$7500 was used for Varanasi Project where the funds are used for the Rent of the Clinic. Animal Birth Control and Anti Rabies Vaccination program and Education and Awareness Program throughout the Banks of the Ganges. This grant also covers Salaries of Veterinary Assistant and Veterinarians.
